Awareness of Complication Management: Students understand common complications (e.g.,

Improved Understanding of Patient Interaction: Students demonstrate empathy and effective communication when observing or engaging with dialysis patients.</p> <p>5. Appreciation of Interdisciplinary Collaboration: Students recognize how nurses collaborate with nephrologists, dietitians, and technicians in managing patient care.</p>
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Summary - During the dialysis unit visit, students gained first-hand exposure to the procedures and environment involved in caring for patients with kidney failure. They observed both haemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis processes, learning about the machines and equipment used, as well as the importance of strict infection control measures to ensure patient safety.

The students also learned about the critical nursing roles before, during, and after dialysis treatment, including patient assessment, monitoring for complications, and providing emotional support. This experience helped students appreciate the complexity of care required for dialysis patients and the importance of teamwork among healthcare professionals.

Overall, the visit enhanced the students' understanding of renal care, increased their confidence in handling dialysis-related equipment, and emphasized the importance of patient-centered care and safety in the dialysis setting.


